USA 50TH JUBILEE OF HOME SHRINES!

Many greetings to all of you who take the time to read our little newsletter from the Schoenstatt Shrine here in the Midwest. I've been writing this one in my head and heart since last Thanksgiving, but it only comes to be typed on this second Schoenstatt milestone anniversary, on January 20, 2013.

With heartfelt *Thanksgiving* we move into the great YEAR OF FAITH – YEAR OF SCHOENSTATT MISSION – and YEAR OF GOLDEN JUBILEE OF THE HOME SHRINE!

The year's motto that began October 18th and runs through until Founding Sunday, October 20, 2013, is:

YOUR HOME SHRINE, OUR MISSION, LIVE IT!

Many of us have a home shrine. We have dedicated a picture of our Mother Thrice Admirable, Queen, and Victress of Schoenstatt, with a crucifix, and a picture of Father Joseph Kentenich at some special place in our home. It is a way to bring those three pilgrimage graces from the Original Schoenstatt Shrine in Germany, through the now over 200 daughter shrines built as exact replicas in over 40 different countries (we have 10 at present in the USA), often via a traveling Pilgrim MTA Shrine (begun in 1950 in Brazil with Mr. John Pozzobon), right into **my family home**.

A title is given to Mary that reflects a name, a mission, a task, a petition, or a historic event which can be called the "personal ideal of our family." Sometimes that family is me, myself, and I; sometimes it is the young family just beginning with children on the way; sometimes it is the empty-nested parents; or it can be a person in consecrated life in simple one-room accommodations. Our Mother and Queen comes into any and

all situations with her promise to accept our invitation, to dwell among us, and to educate us purposefully and constantly into actual holiness! Schoenstatt wants to form and forge, mold and educate the mild and the wild, the precious and the pride-filled, all of us created and born in the image of God to become SAINTS for our families, Church, and society!

This is no easy task. How do we live a mission which is simple but broad, basic but multifaceted, needed but often overwhelming as our Home Shrine Ideal? One step at a time. We want to use this Year of Faith to engage our covenant of love, to realize Mary will indeed carry out her six requests and promises:

"Prove first by your deeds that you really love me; work on your self-education, sanctify your life, fulfill your duties faithfully and conscientiously, and diligently bring me contributions to the capital of grace. Then it will please me to dwell in your midst {in your home shrine} and dispense gifts and graces in abundance. Then from here I will draw youthful hearts to myself and educate them to become useful instruments in my hand." Father Joseph Kentenich, MTA, June 15, 1919

Last October 14th was the 50th anniversary of Father Kentenich blessing the first home shrine in the Milwaukee, Wisconsin, area. This November 18th will be 50 years since he proclaimed the Home Shrine Document: "Everything which holds true for the Original Shrine and for the daughter shrines also holds true for the home shrines." Mary, who we invite into our homes, IS the great missionary, performing miracles in our home shrines. Entrust all of your worries and cares, your fears and concerns, your loved ones and hard to love ones in her motherly educative care. Then trust she will take perfect care!

Featured Schoenstatter: Alice Steffes+



Alice Steffes, a member of the pioneer couples group in Ivanhoe, MN, passed away on November 2, 2012 in Hendricks, MN. Alice and her husband Ray made their home on the family farm where they raised eleven children. Her devotion to Ray and their children created a strong sense of family. Alice was the heart and soul of her family by creating and passing on the family traditions her children and grandchildren will always remember and cherish. Alice's faith in the Blessed Mother and the Church was unwavering. She was active in the Catholic Ladies Guild, taught religious education classes for many years, led the Rosary and distributed Holy Communion in the Hendricks Nursing Home weekly for many years. She was on the selective service board and Willing Workers Neighborhood Group. She also worked at the Divine Providence Hospital and Nursing Home in Ivanhoe.

Her love for the Blessed Mother urged her and Ray to become very faithful members of the Schoenstatt Pioneer Couples group in Ivanhoe in 1969 with eight other couples. They were active in their parish and gave everything for Schoenstatt. When the Schoenstatt Sisters received the new property in Sleepy Eye, Alice, Ray and the other couples often made the 180-mile trip to work on the old farm house and the land so the Sisters of Mary could live in the house. They also were active in working for the shrine. Many sacrifices were brought for this great undertaking.

Since there were nine couples in this group they had a special novena of May Devotions every year. They would meet in each home for devotions and crown the Blessed Mother in their home shrines. It was always a large group because of the many children. They kept up this tradition even after some of the members passed away.

Alice always was ready to help; her love for Schoenstatt formed her life. When most of the members of the pioneer couples had passed away, Alice joined a Mother's group, but still met faithfully with the last members of her couples group. When one of the members passed away the others took care that their large MTA picture was nicely decorated in the funeral home and at Church for the funeral Mass. Alice was a woman of prayer and dedicated to helping others until she died on All Souls Day 2012. May she rest in peace.

Bishop John LeVoir: Continue to Defend Marriage

As you know, the Marriage Protection Amendment which was on the ballot last fall did not pass. If it had passed, it would have preserved marriage as the union of one man and woman in our state constitution, where activist judges and politicians could not redefine it. The amendment was narrowly defeated. Even so, same-sex marriage advocates are now pressing hard to repeal our current Defense of Marriage Act and legalize genderless marriage legislatively in Minnesota. Please keep current on this issue and pray that the authentic definition of marriage as the union of one man and one woman will be preserved and taught. We are reminded by Blessed John Paul II at the conclusion of his Letter to Families, issued in 1994:

"The history of mankind, the history of salvation, passes by way of the family. In these pages I have tried to show how the family is placed at the centre of the great struggle between good and evil, between life and death, between love and all that is opposed to love. To the family is entrusted the task of striving, first and foremost, to unleash the forces of good, the source of which is found in Christ the Redeemer of man. I speak with the power of his truth to all people of our day, so that they will come to appreciate the grandeur of the goods of marriage, family and life; so that they will come to appreciate the great danger which follows when these realities are not respected, or when the supreme values which lie at the foundation of the family and of human dignity are disregarded. May the Holy Family, icon and model of every human family, help each individual to walk in the spirit of Nazareth. May it help each family unit to grow in understanding of its particular mission in society and the Church by hearing the Word of God, by prayer, and by a fraternal sharing of life. May Mary, Mother of 'Fairest Love,' and Joseph, Guardian of the Redeemer, accompany us all with their constant protection."

Beloved Squash & Apple Casserole

Topping - Layer III

4 tsp sugar

3 cups cornflakes, coarsely crumbled

¾ cup pecans, chopped

4 Tbsp butter, melted

Apple Mixture - Layer I

2 ½ Tbsp butter

6 large cooking apples, peeled, cored, and sliced

4 tsp sugar

Squash Mixture - Layer II

6 cups (fresh or frozen) cubed butternut squash, boiled until tender

4 Tbsp butter

2 Tbsp brown sugar

¼ tsp salt

-Preheat oven to 350. Mix topping ingredients in bowl; set aside.

-Prepare apples: Heat butter in skillet over medium heat; add apples and sauté about 3 minutes or until tender. Stir in granulated sugar. Transfer to a glass or ceramic 9x13" baking pan, spreading apples evenly.

-Prepare squash: In a bowl, mash cooked squash with butter, brown sugar & salt. Spread squash evenly over apples. Sprinkle topping on.

-Bake for 20 minutes or until topping is golden brown and crunchy.

Easy Oven Carmel French Toast

Simmer ½ cup of butter with 1 cup of brown sugar until syrupy. You could also add some nuts to this if desired. Pour into 9x13" glass dish. Next place French Bread slices over syrup mixture. Then beat 5 eggs in bowl; adding 1½ cup milk, 1 tsp vanilla, ¼ tsp salt and 2 Tbsp sugar. Pour over the bread, cover and refrigerate overnight.

Bake at 350 degrees for 35 minutes and enjoy.
